## Difference between "C R A Y F I S H" and "L O B S T E R"

- A Lobster has Two large **pincers or claws** whilst a Crayfish doesn't.
- A Crayfish is reddish in **colour** whilst a Lobster is bluish, greenish or brownish.
- When it comes to **flavour**, Crayfish is more subtle while Lobster is usually more intense.
- When a Lobster is cooked, it loses all of its colour pigmentation apart from the colour red, and for this reason, it changes color during cooking.
- If you can put them together and compare them in size, you'll notice that Lobsters (in general) are longer than Crayfish.
- Do not be fooled with Lobsters with no claws, though they may be referred to as Crayfish, this is a common misuse of the term.



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
